The Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) has issued two funding announcements for up to \$68 million “to improve the nation’s capacity to effectively conduct patient-centered comparative clinical effectiveness research (CER). The two linked cooperative agreement funding announcements will support development of a National Patient-Centered Clinical Research Network designed to unite millions of patients through a coordinated collaboration with researchers and healthcare delivery organizations.”



The Vilcek Foundation is seeking **applications for the 2014 Vilcek Prizes for Creative Promise in Biomedical Science**. Three foreign-born biomedical scientists will be selected to receive the prizes, each including a cash award of \$35,000.

Researchers in all fields of biomedical science are encouraged to apply. Applicants must have been born abroad, be naturalized citizens or permanent residents of the United States, hold a doctoral degree, intent to pursue a career in the United States, and be no more than 38 years old as of January 1, 2014. In addition, they must also hold a full-time independent position in an academic institution or other organization.

A written application, professional resume, list of publications, and letters of recommendation are required.

CCTS Summer Research Boot Camp July 8 to August 16, 2013

We are offering a 6 week summer research boot camp which includes lectures, workshops, courses, and a seminar series. The boot camp focuses on the development of clinical investigation skills through the offering of lectures and hands on experiences in epidemiology/study design, biostatistics, and scientific writing.

Participation in the boot camp is open to medical and graduate students, residents, and post-doctoral fellows, junior faculty, and staff throughout the University, its affiliated hospitals, and its CCTS partners.

At the end of this 6 week experience, trainees will begin to understand the nuances of study design, conduct scientific research, data analysis and presentation, and interpretation of study findings. Participants will also be better prepared to enroll in Masters and PhD programs in clinical and public health research.
